Safely Regathering Task Force Update: *"For this very reason, make every effort to support your faith with goodness, and goodness with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and self control with endurance, and endurance with godliness, and godliness with mutual affection, and mutual affection with love."* -- II Peter 1:5-7

In the second letter of Peter, he starts out telling us that God provides us what we need to deal with life. It's almost as if he were speaking to us today in dealings with the pandemic.

In reviewing the data, we see both reason for concern, and reason for optimism.
